2015 Spring season Registration

Early Registration Before January 31st.

- Online registration is available from January 1st
 February 28th.
- Walk in Jan 17th and 24th 10am—12pm

**New Age Determination

Effective for the 2015 season for players born after January 1, 2006. The "baseball age" is determined as of December

31st as opposed to April 30th.

T-Ball League (Age 5): (Birthdates 1/1/10-12/31/10) All 5 Year Old players must play in this league. This league stresses instructional play and teaches basic rules. All players bat in a perpetual batting order with equal playing time in the field. Games will be played during the week and on Saturdays.

Minor B (Age 6): (Birthdates 1/1/09-12/31/09) Our second level of Baseball. "Outs count" at this level. The first three games of the season are T-Ball. The remainder of the season players bat against coach pitching. All players bat in a perpetual batting order with equal playing time in the field. Games will be played during the week and on Saturday along with scheduled practices during the week.

Minor A (Age 7,8):

(Birthdates 1/1/07-12/31/07) The first two third of the season is Machine pitch, while the remainder of the season is entirely player pitch. Scores are not kept during the regular season.

"AAA" (Age 9,10,11):

(Birthdates 5/1/03-12/31/06) "AAA" league is to prepare players for next year, Majors: National League. Players will pitch the entire season. Players will be selected through an evaluation and draft. Playoffs will be played at the end of the season with seeding determined by league standings.

Majors (Ages 10,11,12): A small percentage of players will be drafted into the National League. All the remaining players will be eligible for the American League. After the American League team rosters are filled, the remaining players will be invited to an evaluation for the AAA League.

Age 10 (Birthdates 05/01/04-12/31/05)
Age 11 (Birthdates 05/01/03-04/30/04)
Age 12 (Birthdates 05/01/02-04/30/03)

Majors 50/70 (Ages 11 & 12 ONLY):

This is a very competitive league where the players are selected after a tryout. Play in this league will be on the ex-

panded field (50' mound and 70' base distance).

Majors 46/60 (Ages 9-12): This league prepares a player for the possible move to the 50/70 League next season. A 9 year old may only play in this league as long as he/she is drafted by the end of the

2014 Fall Intramural Soccer

It seems as though the season just kicked off, yet here we are in the afterglow of the Holiday season, looking back at the past year. As intramural soccer commissioner, I was blessed with the opportunity to witness a lot of great soccer matches this past season at all ages ranging from PeeWees to Major B and was thrilled to see how much fun all the children had. This past Fall we were rewarded with one of the largest intramural soccer seasons in Deep Run history. Some quick numbers to back this up: 686 boys and girls played this Fall 54 teams 324 games.

Once again, the athletes played on teams representing countries vying for the World Cup. In addition to perennial favorites like USA, Germany and Brazil, we also saw teams representing Australia and Uruguay for the first time. One of the benefits about the World Cup kits (in addition to looking great) is that it makes our world a little smaller in the eyes of the children and helps them to see that we are all alike in our love of sport. Our child athletes learned great lessons out on the pitch, about communication, overcoming adversity, coming together as a team and about the value of hard work and practice.

The children aren't the only ones who reaped rewards that information back to you from this season. Our volunteer coaches also learned a so that we can take to

lot about a game they perhaps had never played themselves, others learned the joy of giving back, while others were amazed at their ability to corral a dozen little kids and get them to focus on a common goal - a skill not to be underestimated (and which surprisingly also works on adults)!

Spring Soccer registration opens online 01 January, while in person live registration will be help on 10th 17th and 24th of January at the clubhouse from 10 AM to noon. We need coaches (both managers and assistant coaches) for each team, so please consider volunteering in one of those roles - I can't begin to tell you how rewarding it is to coach our great kids. Registration closes on 28 February (at the normal rate of \$75 per player). Those who register early (before the end of January) will be entitled to a discounted fee (\$60 per player). Late registrations will be charged a penalty (for a total of \$90 per player). Remember, to be considered fully registered vou must not only have the registration form filled out and signed, but the fee must be paid in full by the date indicated. Please do your best to register early, or at least on time. When players are registered on time we can order uniforms, identify and assign coaches, select rosters and make game schedules before the season starts and communicate that information back to you so that you can make plans

the fields as soon as the weather allows.

2014 Travel Soccer

Deep Run had 30 travel teams competing in 3 leagues this season. Many teams won or finished second in their division. Our U16 girls Strikers are regionally ranked and are comprised of many of the stars from our high school team. Below is some info on a few of our teams:

The Deep Run Blue Wave U9F had a strong season in 2014. They attended five tournaments throughout the Summer and Fall. Of these, three resulted in 1st place showings: Spirit United Kick-Off Classic, Cape May Express George Pratt Memorial Columbus Day Tournament, and Hempfied Adidas Fall Classic. The remaining two tournaments resulted in a 2nd and 3rd place showing: LVU Lou Ramos Classice - 2nd Place and Deep Run Labor Day Tournament - 3rd Place U10 A Division.

The team competed in PAGS U9 Division 1 for their Fall league play. They completed the season with a 7-2 record, scoring 15 goals along the way while only giving up 3.

Although they achieved a great deal of tournament and league success this year, the team's true success showed in training. Their focus, intensity, and attitude during training was at a high level

throughout the season. This was and will continue to be the engine that drives this team's continued success. Their coaches and parents are all proud of what they have been able to accomplish.

Playoff games would be in addition. Games are scheduled during the week and weekends.

ton and select sports that you wish to register for. You will be asked to set up your own family access for future registrations. It will allow you to add new siblings when needed, change of address or phone numbers and more. You will be able to volunteer for coaching and more. You still will be able to pay online (no Pay Pall fees) or by check within ten days of registration. Remember each sport has three fee structures an early discount, regular timed registration and a

late registration. The savings if registering early are significant so register early.

We continue to use TWIT-TER account for Deep Run called DRVSA1. This is the best and fastest method to find out if the fields are open or closed, registration reminders and the occasional important Deep Run message. If your cell phone accepts text messages you will get a tweet from Deep Run. From our home page click on "follow us on twitter" button. If you have a twitter account just click on the FOLLOW button and

sign up. If you aren't registered, you have to register with twitter (free). You set up an account for yourself (free) make sure you select yes to accept text messages on your cell phone once your account is set up. On our home page there is a link that will show you how to register or answer any registration questions you may have.


