Commissioners Update

- i. Camp Michelle Levush
 - a. Camp registration is 285 to date, last year was 306 total. Great start to this year, families are selecting multiple weeks this year.
 - b. Camp rates were raised this year \$25 and multiweek registrations and sibling discounts were given.
 - c. Closed one week so far that has reached max registration, a few more weeks are close to max. Looking to stay around 100 kids per week.
 - d. The new computer system is working well for registration.
 - e. Camp will be hosting in April to draw older kids.
 - f. Payroll is the biggest issue ahead to stay competitive with other local jobs.
 - g. Restructuring staff to add more managers and asst. managers, all employees will be CPR certified.
 - h. Still working on an in-house calendar, will have a theme each week. Second week of camp there will be a field trip for about 40 of the older kids to the zoo. If all goes well considerations will be made about adding more trips in the future.
 - i. Perkasie Pizza has signed on to supply food for camp lunch.

ii. Basketball – Amy Vansant

- a. Season has wrapped up on 3/18, feedback has been positive. Coaches and players liked the addition of clinics and more practices. Coaches would love more instructional clinics for the players.
- b. Would like to leverage team snap next season for coaches to communicate with their teams and help coaches with their schedules.
